Sisters

For the past five years, the sisters, Anja and Nataša, have been regular attenders of our Good News Club for children and now the Teens Club. Due to low attendance at the Good News Club in their village (near Stara Pazova), I stopped holding a club there but would instead bring a carload of children from the village to the club in Stara Pazova. Anja and Nataša were two of the

regulars. One time at the club, I was teaching the children that we need to be thankful. With the children, we listed the gifts we've received from God. Some of the children mentioned that we need to be thankful for food. The older sister, Nataša (now age 14), said, "We don't always have something to eat." I was surprised to hear this, and on the drive home we continued the conversation. "It's happened before that we only have dry bread to eat," said the sisters. This surprised me, and I began helping them. Their father doesn't make much money. When he is sick and can't go to work, he misses out on the day's pay. Their mother is unemployed. Because their clothes show that they are poor, the children at school laugh at them. They mainly wear what others have given them. Very rarely do they have anything new.

In September, Nataša will be starting high school at a school 70 km from Stara Pazova. She needs 100 euros to pay for the student dorm and to be able to travel home sometimes during the semester. She also needs money for books, clothes, and other necessities.

The girls need help. If you or someone you know is able to help them, especially the older Nataša, I would appreciate it.

If God wills, in September I will start living in Čačak. Sometimes when I think about this I start to be afraid and worried. The scripture in Acts 17:34-35 encouraged me. Paul was preaching in Thessalonica. Some mocked him, but others believed.

- **Please pray with me that there will be those who believe in Čačak, and also that the Lord provides the finances for the apartment that I will need.**
